

OWEN BOWEN 1873-1967

Owen Bowen was educated at Leeds High School and afterwards studied during the evenings at Leeds School of Art, acquiring his artistic skills there from Gilbert Foster RBA. He is particularly known for his oil and watercolour views of Yorkshire, with Dales and coastal scenes a speciality. He settled in East Keswick near Leeds and regularly spent his summers holidaying on the Yorkshire coast, having bought himself a cottage in Robin Hood's Bay. Along with Ulric Walmsley, Bowen was a founder member of the Fylingdales Group, and after World War II he was made president of the Royal Cambrian Academy for a number of years.
