ROWLAND HENRY HILL 1873-1952

Born in Halifax in 1873, Rowland Henry Hill was a landscape painter in both oils and watercolours who studied at the Halifax School of Art and exhibited regularly at the Royal Academy from 1897.

He lived at Ellerby Lodge, Hinderwell, and painted many local scenes, but also travelled and painted in many other European countries. Examples of his work are in the Imperial War Museum and several other Public Galleries.
